NESVRSTANI ZAGREB

Nesvrstani Zagreb (Non-Aligned Zagreb) is a research project I started in 2019. It deals with the histories of students from the Global South who relocated to Zagreb between the 1960s and 1980s as part of Yugoslavia's involvement in the Non-Aligned Movement solidarity. My research efforts have yielded published texts for the Booksa literary portal, a short film titled *Grad koji ima mir* (The City That Has Peace), and an exhibition at Galerija VN in Zagreb.

Grad koji ima mir (The City That Has Peace) is a documentary film following the rise and fall of Zagreb's International Student Club. Exploring topics of solidarity, war, and community, Sam Bushara and Mohamed Al Younis lead us through the largely forgotten history of Non-Aligned Zagreb. Looking back on their journeys, they reflect on the tenderness and unity they encountered in Zagreb but which are no longer there.

COLLABORATION, CURATION, PRODUCTION

ZAJEDNO (U POKRETU)





The artistic project Zajedno: tragovima Udruženja kurdskih studenata (Together: following the traces of the Kurdish Student Union) examines the history of the Kurdish Student Union which was active in Zagreb from 1966 to 1990. Together with the interdisciplinary Kurdish Syrian artist Bahzad Sulaiman, we use artistic research to get to know the local history of Kurdish students and the present of contemporary Croatian citizens of Middle Eastern origin. The project in May and June 2023 involves a residency in Zagreb including meetings and workshops with the local artists, anthropologists, communities, and former international students, as well as Kurdish folklore dance workshops in Zagreb, Split, and Šidski Banovci village at the Croatian-Serbian border, recalling the traditions of the Zagreb Kurdish Student Union whose work involved activities promoting Kurdish history and culture.

CRNO-BIJELO







Crno-bijelo (Black-white) is a book club focusing on the problems of (post)colonialism, racism, borders, and migration.


Crno-bijelo is a space of knowledge exchange, learning and unlearning, space of discussion and free will for all interested in the topics of decolonization and the anti-colonial, race and racialization, border regimes, and forced migration. *Crno-bijelo* is imagined as a laboratory where we develop anti-colonial strategies together and create togetherness.

Our first meeting in May 2023 featured Dr Sunnie Rucker-Chang, Associate Professor at the Ohio State University in the Department of Slavic and East European Languages and Cultures and the Department of African American and African Studies.

Through subverting the institution of the office, we inquired into togetherness, belonging, and inhabiting in dialogue with passers-by. My contribution focused on *The Welcoming Department*, trying out ways to welcome people to new spaces. an office appeared in two editions.

One was *Dead Dove: Do Not Eat* for documenta fifteen in ruruHaus, Kassel, August 2022, and the second was *Practices of Belonging* for Fotograf Festival in Jeleni Gallery, Prague in September 2022.

THE WELCOMING MUSEUM



The Welcoming Museum workshop focuses on European museums' work with forced migrants.

The workshop is based on my collaboration with the Technical Museum Nikola Tesla, Ethnographic Museum, and Typhlological Museum from 2018 to 2020. It involves mapping local resources and practices and researches contemporary museological practices connected to forced migration and *integration*.

Pazar znanja/Placa znanja (knowledge market) is a participatory knowledge exchange workshop, collaborative exhibition and guided tour using ruangrupa/Serrum pasar ilmu methodology, enabling all the participants to act as both the teacher and the student. In 2022, it was conducted for LGBT Centre Split, Culture Hub Croatia, and the Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art Rijeka.

Delo Lab is an open collaborative research platform produced for BIO26|Common Knowledge - Ljubljana Design Biennial, commissioned by MAO - Museum of Architecture and Design Ljubljana in 2019.

Members of the design group are Maxime Benvenuto, Petra Matić, Mateja Mlinarič, José Tomás Pérez Valle, and Zuzanna Zgierska, under the mentorship of Bureau d'Études and Ali Žerdin. Delo Lab rebuilds the collective memory to create new narratives, discover common history, and heal the community. In the time of information crisis, community and archives remain sources of knowledge we can rely on. In Delo Lab the newspaper archive opens towards the community and uses the feedback to add previously unpublished stories and information into its collections. The readership gets an opportunity to tell their stories, which are then placed into a broader common narrative.
